

10 SHOT PHOTO CHALLENGE #3

Description: This project is designed to work on your photography, editing, and creativity skills. You need to take 10 different photographs and edit them using the app/software of your choice. You don't have to worry about being the best photographer to be successful at this project. Please focus on fulfilling each category while getting creative with each photo and trying out the newly discovered composition techniques in photography! You should create a "10 Shot Photo Challenge #3 (Last Name)" folder in your "Multimedia" folder in Google Drive for your photos. In this Google Drive folder, you need to include the photos (change the names of the files to match the categories please - ex. "Smith_Winter") and a Google Slides Presentation (change the name of the presentation to "Smith_Presentation") with a slide for each photo as well as a description of your process of taking the photo and a few more thoughts about the photo (when you took it, where you took it, and the different composition techniques you included - see second page of this document for an example).

1. **Spring Break** - capture something that represents your Spring Break
2. **Jump** - capture someone in mid-air
3. **Depth of Field** - show off a shallow depth of field (some part is blurry which brings the focus on the sharp element) or a deep depth of field (foreground and background visible)
4. **Alphabet** - capture something that has letters in it (get creative!) or something outside that looks like a letter
5. **Simple** - Capture something simple that makes a statement (remember negative space!)
6. **Architecture** - find a stunning building or physical structure and get a photo from an interesting angle/perspective
7. **Black and White** - anything you want that you think would look good in black and white
8. **Something Beginning with 'E'** - anything you want!
9. **Something Blue** - find a fun way to represent the color blue
10. **Miscellaneous** - here's your chance to show off a great photo you took without having to satisfy a category!

Tips: Try to think of all the different composition techniques (rule of thirds, rule of odds, lines, leading lines, contrast, color, patterns, symmetry, leaving space, shallow depth of field, deep depth of field, worm's eye view, bird's eye view, framing, simplicity, balance, fill the frame, texture, and orientation) in photography to improve your photos.

Winners: I will pick a winner for each category from each hour. Winners and their photos will be tweeted out from @Mr_D_Reeves. Include your Twitter @ in your Google Slides Presentation opening slide if you would like to be mentioned in the tweet. Each winner will receive 5 extra credit points on the assignment!
